Minutes of November 7th, 2019 at The Original Sunrise Café in Middleton, ID.

Maria brought the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

October secretary minutes were reviewed, and it was brought up that the minutes should be amended for record purposes that the ballots for elections in 2020 were sent to Jane Steele before counting, and not to Kelli Phillips like originally decided. Felicia made a motion to accept the amendment and therefore the minutes after the amendment is made, Jamey seconded the motion. Motion passed by the club.

Treasurer's report: Beginning balance: \$4,520.27. Payments were \$907.00 in total; \$100 for change for the play day, \$221 for horse beanies, \$344 for the Halloween play day, \$232 for the silent auction, and \$10 for a membership. Outstanding checks are one in the amount of \$100.00 that is being held by the Birches as a cleaning deposit for the end of the year banquet in December and one more for the amount \$200.00 for Al Birt Arena. Expenses were \$800.00 in total; \$100 for change for the playday, \$200 for Birt Arena, and \$500 for horse beanies. Cash on-hand is still \$50.00 with the Secretary, which brings the ending balance to \$4,677.27. Felicia motioned to accept the treasurers report and Pam seconded. The motion passed by the club.

OLD BUSINESS

-Banquet committee- The club voted on what food they wanted catered through Dickey's BBQ. There will be some soft drinks, coffee, and hot chocolate available through the club, but you may also bring your own drink. Remember, there is no alcohol allowed! The costs are \$16 for non-members, \$5.50 for members because the club is paying half of the members fee. It has been brought up that there will be limited parking around the area, so if you can carpool please do! The address is 16390 N. Franklin Blvd. and we will be meeting in the main club house at 1 p.m.

-SWAG- At the past couple of meetings Kelli has passed around an order sheet for people to make orders for shirts and sweatshirts. If you would like to make an order you can email or call her.

- -Eagle Harvest Festival- Once again, the club with their minis was a huge hit. The bookmarks that were made were also a great idea so there will be more of them next year, as well as pamphlets about the club and minis!
- -FUN committee- The play day was great and everyone had fun! The committee is already thinking about changing some of the courses and possibly splitting levels between beginner and advanced for more possible fun!
- -By-Law committee- The committee met and looked over the by-laws for the discussion of allowing those with ponies into the club. The club's name would not have to change and there is no mention of a height cap anywhere in the by-laws. It's only stated that the club is here to:

SECTION 102. GOALS.

- A. To develop and promote the miniature horse
- B. To develop and promote good fellowship among other people and associates.
- C. To encourage breeding, training, and exhibition of good quality miniature horses.
- D. To cooperate with all equine breed registries.
- E. To preserve the Health and Welfare of the miniature horse.

It was discussed that the committee make up a sheet explaining more in detail what all of this would change and not change so that more people could understand it and there will be voting at the January meeting. The committee also discussed the fact that there was no description of what elected directors were supposed to do. They would like more duties lined out for them.

Mark your calendars for the Middleton Chamber's Christmas parade, A Christmas Carol on Saturday, December 14.



I took Splash and Gabby to the Megan Sibiga Clinic. Splash is Gabby's half sister and is 3 years old. She is a goof and lacks the focus that her sister has. I ground drove her and worked on just staying in between the lines. She is very fussy with the bit so Megan and I discussed a plan to work her through it. We worked her on listening and not being afraid of the dark spots on the rail. By the end she was finally getting it. She is going to be fun to start to drive,

but a little more challenging than her sister as she is a little more reactive to things.

Gabby was a rock star as usual. Jamey and I had done some work with her 4 days before the clinic. She did her first solo drive (just down the lane and back) with Joey and Jamey as moral support on the day before the clinic. Even with the terrible wind, dogs barking, and leaves flying she did well. When we got to the clinic, Megan and I visited about where she was at in her cart training I ground drove her, got her thinking and moving lightly in the bridle. She was quiet, so we attached the cart to her. No Joey for moral support this time. She did great. We worked on circles, figure 8's, walk, trot, moving forward, and then coming back to me. I learned




some better cues for her so that she stays working straight and she learns to balance with the cart. We talked about what to do if something were to scare her. She said that at that point she would have to go back to her beginning training. When we were ground driving we worked on whoa a lot, but found out if you tell her she's a good girl, she stops. Megan said she was good girl broke. Now I just need to work on her gaining more strength as we start driving longer distances. Megan felt that we had started her well and she will be a solid driving horse for a very long time.

If you have never attended one of her clinics it is well worth the time and money. She is very good at pointing out things that you didn't even know that you were doing.


