Driving Class Entries At the Fair submitted by Robin DeLong

There were 3 horses on Tues., Aug. 23, and 4 horses on Wed., Aug 24, and 2 ponies both days and 6 minis.

Pleasure Driving, Tuesday, August 23: Donna Bernardelli and Handy ,and Robin DeLong and Skye, were the ponies. On Tues., Donna and Handy were winning the rail classes. Handy was stopping and standing when the judge asked for a halt. Donna was cool and collected. I was struggling to keep Skye cool and collected. Finally at the Musical freestyle Skye agreed to listen to me a little bit. The music is so fun, and I think she enjoyed it. Donna and Handy did a great musical freestyle also. Everyone who did the musical freestyle did a great job. Donna and Handy had 3 firsts and 1 second. Robin and Skye won the musical freestyle. We had 3 seconds and I first.

Obstacle Driving, Wed., August 24: Wed. morning was the cones classes. The first class was Gambler's Choice. Skye and I did the easy options and Skye listened well, and we smoked the obstacles. Handy was not impressed and did not listen. Donna was disappointed when she had to leave the arena.

While the amazing ground crew was setting up for Progressive Cones, Donna and Handy followed Skye and Robin back into the arena. We drove around in big circles, visiting with the ground crew, looking at scary things until Handy and Donna felt comfortable again. When it was our turn, Skye was right there ready for any slight command, and we made it through until the last cone, which we hit. It was very narrow! We stayed in the arena so Handy could see us. When he was in and relaxed, Skye and I left the arena. Donna did great but hit a cone before the end of the course. (I think she hit cone 3 but I can't remember and don't want to hurt her feelings.) The next class was Timed Cones. Skye and I were together and going fast. No balls down or time penalties. Again, we helped Handy get into the arena. Donna and Handy were calm and steady. I'm not sure who won that class.

The final class was Double Jeopardy. One driver drives the cones 1,2,3, etc, the second driver goes backwards 10,9,8, etc. My friend and I are defending champions from last year. Skye was pulling hard with two old ladies in the cart. Kathy was fast but knocked down one ball. I drove backwards and didn't hit any balls. Our time was good also. Donna had Jamey Robbins, who is a great driver, as her partner. Both Donna and Jamey drove perfectly and didn't have any balls down. I think they won that one. Most drivers, because of the hot sun, put their horses away. Skye stood in the shade of the horse stalls. Standing is a good exercise for Skye. In the end Skye and I won High Point Pony and Senior Driver trophies. I thought Donna had won it! Donna said Skye and I won by two points! Next year is going to be a battle. Despite the hot sun, I had a great time visiting with the other drivers and helpers. The Frrsian horse was amazing to watch and Tamara Cook did an amazing job driving him. They won the Concours de Elegance. Tamara was beautiful in her red hat and jacket driving a beautiful black horse. Jamey Robbins and Joey won the 125 Anniversary of the fair belt buckle. Beautifull buckle! I'm not sure who won the horse and mini classes. I heard Jamey and Joey's names a lot. Tim Phillips was driving the only mule. They did a great job too.
